¹Art option #1 requires two courses from ART 123, 125, 126, or 142.

²Art option #2 requires six semester hours selected from ART 236, *240, *241, *242, *244, or *345. ART 241, 242, 244 are offered once a year either spring or fall.

³Art option #3 requires six semester hours selected from Art 306 (fall only odd years), *320, *420, *440, or *445.

A major in art requires at least **39 hours** in the department including **ART 111, 121, 200, 201, 302 and 450**. Six semester hours from 123, 125, 126 or 142; six semester hours from ART 236, 240, 241, 242, 244, 345 [241, 242, or 244 may be repeated once for additional credit and only one of these courses may be repeated]; six semester hours from ART 306, 320, 420, 440, 445 [320, 420, 440 require 211, a 200 level studio course and consent of the instructor]. Refer to the Academic Catalog for specific semester and year offerings.

Secondary Art Education Requirements: Students who wish to qualify for Illinois Standard High School Certificate should take TEDP377--Secondary Visual Arts (offered every other Spring only alternate years 08, 10). To qualify for the Special Certificate Program, both EDUC 377 –Foundations of Art Education and TEDP377--Secondary Visual Arts should be taken. Additional course requirements for teacher certification are found in the Education Department.

Students should contact the Art Department for the special course requirements of the 3-4 Architectural Program.
