Notes:

1. Business 105 is not required but is a good background introduction.
2. Economics majors should have strong quantitative skills. Math 106 is sufficient but minimal statistical preparation.
3. Economics 200 should be taken by the end of the sophomore year at the latest. Taking Econ 200, 300 & 301 before taking upper level electives will enable the student to gain a more complete understanding of upper level electives and will facilitate subsequent off-campus study.
4. Econ 300 & 301 may be delayed until the junior year (see note #3).
5. Math 151 & 152 and Busi 211 & 212 are desirable but not required for the major. Students considering graduate school should take Math 151 & 152.

6. Econ 371 is only offered in alternate years. Students should take the course in their fifth or seventh semester.
7. Majors are urged to consider off-campus study. The Washington program during the sixth semester and the Oak Ridge program during the seventh semester are highly desirable experiences.
8. Majors who do not study off-campus are encouraged to enroll in a local public policy oriented internship during the senior year.
9. Business 306 and 356 are not required but are highly recommended.
