Optional Grade Level Endorsements to the Secondary/Special Certificate

- There are three ways to earn an optional endorsement from Monmouth College to your certificate at the time of entitlement:
 - Option 1: 24 credits in the content-area & pass the ICTS content-area exam
 - Option 2: 32 credits in the content-area
 - Option 3: Complete the Monmouth College major in the content-area

- Optional 9-12 endorsement areas & specific course requirements:
 - Drama/Theatre (24 credits in CATA)
 - English (24 credits in ENGL including ENGL 200, 201, 2 ENGL from 220,221,224,225, and a Shakespeare course)
 - Foreign Language-French (24 credits in FREN beyond 102)
 - Foreign Language-Latin (24 credits in LATN beyond 102)
 - Foreign Language-Spanish (24 credits in SPAN beyond 102)
 - Health Education (24 credits in PHED including PHED 180, 220, 250, 315, 421, 423, 425, 430; must also take TEDP 379 not part of 24 credits)
 - Mathematics (24 credits in MATH)
 - Music (24 credits in MUSI)
 - Physical Education (24 credits in PHED)
 - Science-Biology (24 credits in science including 12 credits in BIOL & 1 course in 2 other sciences, & remaining credits in any science)

 - Social Science (24 credits in social sciences including 12 credits in 1 social science, 1 course in 2 other social sciences, & remaining credits from any social science)
 - Speech/Theatre (24 credits in CATA)
