Notes:

¹ The department recommends that students take at least one of SOCI 101, SOCI 102 or ANTH103 during their first year; a minimum of one is required for the major.

² MATH 106 may be taken any time prior to SOAN 302. Under special circumstances and with the instructor's permission, MATH 106 may be taken as a co-requisite with SOAN 302.

³ Typically students will take 301 and 302 during the junior year, but they may be taken during the sophomore year with the department's permission. They do not have to be taken in sequence.

1. A major in Sociology/Anthropology requires 33 semester hours in the department including: one course at the 100 level; SOAN 301; SOAN 302 (prerequisite MATH 106, minimum grade of C-); SOAN 410; SOAN 420; and six additional courses, at least five of which must be above the 100 level. Of these six courses, a minimum of two must be taken in both Sociology (SOCI) and Anthropology (ANTH). Consult with the department for further details.
